All sites continue with Covid-19 protocols in place. <u>EAST</u> TBM D - Selina - Eastbound CHAWF to ABMPS TBM Annie – North westbound GREPS to CHAWF Status of sites in East area identified – CHAWF, KEMPF and GREPS (Deptford Creek). CHAWF - tunnelling almost 75% complete. Muckaway 426 barge loads = 500,000T+; ring 2236 out of 3040 in total. Segments delivered by river – 105 barge loads = 2520 rings = 17,640 segments. No more long stoppages planned. Aim		
	tunnel completion - end of April 2022. KEMPF – 1 barge movement – 500T. Expecting 2 more loads – one w/c 21/2 and one early in March 2022. GREPS – River muckaway – 236 barge loads = 99,782T; Road muckaway – 7,376 lorry loads = 123,390T. Road/river ratio 55%/45%. Moved 30% of total material from GRECT by river exceeding commitment of 24% by river. If tunnelling continues at same pace completion expected wk/com 4/4/22.
