KING EDWARD MEMORIAL PARK TEMPORARY PLAYGROUND CLOSURE

The site team will soon begin drainage installation work within the temporary access road that services the King Edward Memorial Park Foreshore Tideway site.

It will be completed using three areas of excavation and while foreshore pedestrian access will be maintained throughout, from Monday 6 May the playground will be closed for around three weeks for safety reasons, but we will endeavour to reopen it as soon as safely possible.

Our King Edward Memorial Park Foreshore site is part of the London super sewer project, a 25km tunnel under the Thames designed to prevent sewage pollution of the river.

Later this year we will begin commissioning the new super sewer, which means we will start reducing the amount of untreated sewage discharged into the River Thames.

The Thames Tideway Tunnel will become fully operational in 2025.
