GREENWICH PUMPING STATION

ACOUSTIC ENCLOSURE UPDATE

A majority of the acoustic enclosure's cladding is complete. A section has been left temporarily uncovered for the gantry cranes to be lifted inside.

We plan to start installing the gantry cranes later this month, followed by the final section of cladding on the acoustic enclosure.

This will include around two weeks' further night works for activities close to the Docklands Light Railway (DLR), as they need to take place when the DLR is not operational (approximately 00:30 / 01:30 to 05:00). Preparatory works such as moving cranes, setting up and closing down activities are permitted between the hours of 22:00 and 07:00.

Some of this work may be noisy. We apologise for any disturbance and will do our best to minimise disruption.

SHAFT EXCAVATION

Before the gantry cranes are installed, we will start excavation of the shaft, which consists of digging and removing material using excavators until we get to a depth of 51 metres.

There is an old concrete cooling pond around 5 metres deep within the shaft which will need to be removed by breaking out the concrete. This work will take place in normal working hours.

In April, once the acoustic enclosure is complete, we plan to start continuous working within the enclosure to excavate the shaft, 24-hours per day, Monday to Friday.

The doors of the enclosure will be closed for the night from 18:00, although there may be occasions when they are re-opened in the evening (up to 22:00) for plant movements. There will be no vehicles removing spoil after 18:00.
