

Monthly Report of the Independent Compensation Panel Chair

February 2018

The Independent Compensation Panel (the 'Panel') met on one occasion in February 2018. The Panel's Medical Specialist was on leave for the latter half of February. Three meetings are planned for March 2018 to compensate.

13 February (ICP80)

Purpose

To determine medical special case and compensation claims.

Panel Members

I was joined by a Medical Specialist, a Noise & Vibration Specialist and Compensation Specialists, as appropriate.

Decisions of the Panel

Item 1

The Panel received a compensation claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717747). The Panel required more information from the Claimant before the claim could be determined.

Item 2

The Panel received the additional information it had requested at its meeting on 19 December 2017 (ICP#77) in relation to a compensation claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717746). The Panel **Approved** the claim in full and suggested some options for future claims.

Item 3

The Panel received an email from a Claimant seeking clarification of the approach taken by the ICP (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717749) in relation to his compensation claim that came before the Panel on 10 October 2017 (ICP#72). The Panel answered the Claimant's queries.

Item 4

The Panel received the additional information it had requested at its meeting on 16 January 2018 (ICP#78) in relation to a compensation claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717761). The Panel will visit the Claimant's premises to obtain more information on the office location, its internal layout and glazing system.

Item 5

The Panel received the additional information it had requested at its meeting on 10 October 2017 (ICP#72) in relation to a special medical case claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717752). The Panel requires a visit to the Claimant's property in order to assess the light intrusion as the photographs submitted by both the Claimant and the Project are inconclusive.

Item 6

The Panel received a special medical case claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717746). The Panel **Approved** the claim for additional TAP noise mitigation.

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Item 7

The Panel received a special medical case claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717751). There is a need for further information from the Claimant's General Practitioner before the Panel can determine the claim.

Item 8

The Panel received a special medical case claim (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717750). The Panel **Approved** respite breaks equivalent to one day per week, in part, up to a maximum of £30 for each approved person per day, in accordance with Tideway's standard conditions and on production of receipts.

Item 9

Urgent Medical Case

The Panel received an email from the Project raising a question concerning the temporary accommodation provided to a particular Claimant (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717808). The Panel requires more information before we can respond to the query.

Item 10

Urgent Medical Case

The Panel received an email from the Project concerning whether a claim for compensation for loss of rent would be admissible (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717806).

The claim would be admissible if it fulfils the requirements of section 8.2 of the *Non-Statutory Off-site mitigation and compensation policy*. Any claim would then be treated on its merits to establish what, if any, loss has been suffered as result of the scheme. The Panel notes that the Claimant has acquired the property in the full knowledge of the scheme.

Item 11

The Panel received an email from the Project following requests from a Claimant to clarify some of the ICP's decisions (ref. 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-717807). The Panel responded to the request.

Other matters

1. The Minutes of ICP#79 stated:

The Chair notes that there are outstanding actions from FLO in relation to the Conditions imposed by the ICP on the Camelford House TAPs on 16 October 2017 and 19 December 2017 and requests that the information be provided to the ICP without further delay.

Nothing has been provided.

The Chair is now requiring this information in time for the ICP's meeting on 13 March 2018, otherwise the matter will be escalated.

2. The Chair requires that an update on the TAP for Leeward Court be provided in time for the ICP's meeting on 13 March 2018.
