

Heathwall Overview and Update



Landside works:

- Highway modifications complete
- Combined Sewer Overflow shaft segmental primary lining ongoing
- Land piling for future interception chamber complete

Marine works in the river:


- Backfill of cofferdam complete
- River wall piles reinforced concreting complete
- Mooring piles and 'camp shed' works started.




We have installed 12 segment rings and excavated down to 11m


Once complete, the shaft will be 47m deep

Secant and river wall piling complete – 42 river wall piles and 51 secant piles installed


Currently preparing for second shaft to intercept the pumping station overflows. Also constructing a working platform and holding area for muck and remove all muck produced by barge

 Combined Sewer Overflow shaft segmental lining ongoing




Marine


Heathwall Pumping Station – Air Quality (March – June 2019)

Site (Surface) establishment for Tunnelling operations – Complete

Westbound (Millicent) - 2.3km of tunnel excavation completed


Eastbound (Ursula) – Umbilical launch completed and 395m of tunnel excavation completed


California crossing installed in Millicent to allow for train movements within tunnel




How we are managing the site

- Acoustic blankets around conveyor transfer hoppers
- Screening on jetty
- Electric jet-wash on barge
- Plant operatives briefed to allow muck to pile up in Brooks Court where possible and to be considerate of neighbours
- Conveyor alarm switched to flashing lights outside of daylight hours
- Conveyor alarms with lower volume fitted following extensive liaison with manufacturer
- Muck bay assessed for dry muck / potential dust and damped down when safe to do so during dry weather
- White noise alarms on plant
- Dedicated road sweeper

350 heavy goods vehicles taken off the road




Kirtling Street Environment – Air Quality (March – June 2019)






Daytime (Core) - April'19











How do I submit my claim?

- The IAS can send you a claim form, or you can download a claim form off the Tideway website


