

Site Offices Shaft & Interception Camp shed Chamber

Landside works:


- Counters Creek Access Gallery Works
- Deep obstruction removal
- Guidewall Construction for Secant Piling works
- Working Platform for Piling Operations
- Secant piling works commenced in Combined Sewer Overflow Shaft & Interception Chamber

Marine works in the river:

- Campshed regrade & construction
- Pneumatic Fender Installation on the river wall
- New access ladder to the foreshore
- Installation of 2 Fender Piles for protection of existing jetty
- Installation of mooring bollards



Cremorne Wharf CSO Shaft & Interception Chamber Works









CSO Shaft:

Completed installation of 17 out of 52 Secant Piles (down to 16.0m depth).

Interception Chamber:

Completed installation of 9 out of 57 Secant Piles (down to 18.70m depth).

Once complete, the shaft will be 47m deep


Westbound (Millicent) – 3746m of tunnel excavation completed



Exceedances from May to August: 10

26 June 2019 (2)

- One exceedance outside working hours
- Removal of obstructions from ATU unit on going.

27 June 2019

• Backfilling of one of the area of the site (close to the monitor location). Demobilization of the marine subcontractor.

28 June 2019

Delivery of dry aggregates. Backfilling and compacting.

04 July 2019

• Guide wall steel fixing, preparation for concrete, housekeeping, infill of cores in Chelsea Wharf.

08 July 2019 (2)

• Fixing steel reinforcement for protection slab; CSO guide wall construction (reinforcement and shutter for pm pour).

06 August 2019

• Piling excavation for drop shaft. Muck away and concreting operations.

14 August 2019

Piling excavation for drop shaft. Muck away and concreting operations.











Cremorne Wharf Depot – Noise (May – August 2019)




Cremorne Wharf Depot – Noise Monitoring Data May 2019




Cremorne Wharf Depot – Noise Monitoring Data June 2019






