









Carnwath Road Riverside Tunnelling site set-up



Carnwath Road Riverside Barge movements

- Environmentally sensitive tugs –
 Christian and Felix
- Around 72000 tonnes of muck removed from tunnelling so far
- Each 1000 tonne barge equates to 50 lorries
- Around 3000 segments delivered, removing over 500 lorries from local road network since the start of tunnelling

Carnwath Road Riverside Long term

Key dates:

- Tunnelling complete July/August 2020
- Secondary lining August 2020 for nine/ten months
- Shaft works May 2021 Dec 2021
- Surface civil works June 2021 Jan 2022
- Landscaping works Jan 2022 April 2022
- Site demobilisation March 2022 July 2022
- BMB vacate site September 2022
- System testing and commissioning continues until 2024, though minimal on-site activity

WORKS UPDATE – CARNWATH ROAD RIVERSIDE

Work at our Carnwath Road Riverside site is progressing well as we prepare to commence tunnelling in late April

We have recently moved Rachel, our Tunnel Boring Machine (TBM), from site and lowered her into the shaft, before she begins her journey from Carnwath Road Riverside to Acton Storm Tanks.

In preparation for our tunnelling activities we are continuing to install the conveyor system which will allow us to remove excavated material from the tunnel and load it onto our barges. This will minimise our impact on the local road network as each barge movement equates to approximately 50 lorries.

Between Monday 25 February and late March, we will have a maximum of ten nights with approximately six lorries coming to site. The lorries will arrive between 1800hrs – 0800hrs. We will have a range of measures in place to minimise any impact on our neighbours. These will include, but are not limited to, work within the acoustic shed stopping while the shed door opens to allow vehicle access; the shed door to be closed as soon as lorry has entered; and any fory reversing to take place within shed.

These works are necessary to provide the concrete required to finish the infilling within the TBM launch chamber, ready for our TBM to be moved along this chamber now that she has been lowered.

CONCRETE POUR: FACTS AND MITIGATION FRIDAY 7 SEPTEMBER – MONDAY 10 SEPTEMBER

About the base plug pour:

- 3000m³ volume of concrete coming onto site
- The expected rate of pour is 75m³ per hour
- · Approximately 400 lorries will be used
- . The continuous pour will take up to 96 hours
- We will be using the concrete batching plant across the river (5 mins from site, on the south side of Wandsworth Bridge)
- A secondary concrete plant will be on standby in Wimbledon (16 mins away from site)

How we will manage the works:

- · All vehicles coming onto site will be kept behind a screened area
- There will be a radio link between the concrete supplier and the site team to ensure number of lorries on site is controlled
- All reversing lorries will take place in the shed and will be fitted with a white noise audible alarm
- Between 10pm and 8am, the acoustic shed door will only be open as far as necessary to allow lorries to leave
- . Members of the BMB team will be on duty throughout the concrete pour
- Traffic marshalls will be positioned between the concrete batching plant and the site to ensure smooth traffic flow


- Commitment to replace hoarding artwork every two years.
