NOTICE OF 24-HOUR CLOSURE OF PUTNEY BRIDGE

As part of our essential work to build London's new 'super sewer' we are writing to let you know about a part-closure of Putney Bridge from 4am on Sunday 2 February to 4am on Monday 3 February 2020.

The southbound side of the bridge will be closed to general traffic with alternative routes in place. The bridge will remain open to pedestrians, cyclists and buses.

The northbound side of the bridge will be open to traffic but restricted to one lane only, alternating with southbound buses, so delays are expected.



The closure will be lifted at 4am on Monday 3 February with the bridge re-opened to all traffic.

The closure is essential to allow us to safely remove major equipment from our site at Putney Bridge, which requires us to install and use a large crane on the south side of the bridge.
