



MAIN TUNNEL PROGRESS



- Main tunnel drive completed and Tunnel Boring Machine Selina arrived at Abbey Mills shaft.
- 5.5km of tunnel constructed with 700,000t of material mined and removed from site by barge.
- Tunnelling started June 2021 and completed in April 2022.
- The team worked 24/7 only stopping for 12 days at Christmas.







GREENWICH TUNNEL PROGRESS



- Greenwich TBM (Annie) arrived at Chambers Wharf shaft in April 2022.
- The TBM is currently being dismantled with components lifted to the surface and loaded on to barges.








REMOVAL OF TUNNELLING EQUIPMENT



- 11km of slurry pipework removed.
- Tunnelling locos and rolling stock removed.
- Grout plant removed from the acoustic building.









SLURRY TREATMENT PLANT REMOVAL PROGRESS



- Slurry Treatment Plant decommissioned and cleaned ready for dismantling.
- Silos emptied and removed.
- Pipe bridge dismantled and removed from site.
- L-blocks removed around muck storage area.

- Slurry Treatment Plant removal works.
- Greenwich Tunnel Boring Machine and gantry removal.







Tideway East commitment to volunteering...

- Staff from Chambers Wharf undertook a 5km indoor row on 25th May and a 5km walk on 31st May as part of the <u>AHOY5KMay</u> challenge

- Tideway East have been collaborating with Charity 15billionebp for their Building Opportunities and Skills Seminars events in east London schools.
- Staff delivered several sessions to 14 and 15 year olds on CV writing, interview presentation and identifying skills for the workplace.
- Tideway Environmental Team also collaborated on a new environment jobs theme for their World of Work programme for primary school children.



Volunteering & Fundraising

- Our staff took part again in Thames 21 foreshore clean ups, this time Putney MP Fleur Anderson was in attendance, helping Thames 21 with their Citizen Science project
- Construction Superintendent for Tideway East walked from Twickenham to Excel to mark the start of National Construction Week and raise sponsorship for the Construction Sport Foundation (over £4,350)
- Our first staff member has announced he will be running the London Marathon this Autumn, raising funds for the Wellchild charity
- Senior General Foreman raised over £2,000 for the British Heart Foundation when completing the annual London to Brighton bike ride last month
- The Chambers Wharf site team bake sale raised over £600 for construction mental health charity Lighthouse

George Row Playground


Work has started to redevelop the George Row playground.
