Tunnel complete & connecting up

- Final major construction work complete underground, and we are now starting to clean up the river!
 - ✓ First sites have been switched on, with new tunnel starting to protect River Thames from sewage pollution for the first time
 - ✓ First data records half a million cubic metres of sewage captured by the tunnel network in 24-hour period (23 Sept)
 - ✓ Teams now working to bring system into full operation
 ✓ Project on track for completion in 2025
- Picture top right Abbey Mills shaft cover slab lifted and moved into position, effectively sealing the tunnel
- Picture bottom right Wall between Lee Tunnel and Tideway Tunnel removed creating one continuous tunnel






Greenwich Pumping Station – recent progress

- All civils works complete
- Refurbishment of the pumping station roof complete
- 95% the site temporary platform has been removed
- Final landscaping for the surface works has started
- 1st phase of the Deptford Creek marine works was completed in Apr-2024
- Mechanical and electrical works (inside East Beam Engine House) are 95% complete
















