	PB welcomed everybody and introductions were made.
	It was noted that Allen Summerskill who has represented Tideway at the Community Liaison Working Group (CLWG) for many years has now left the project.

2 Notes and actions from last meeting

PB ran through the outstanding actions from previous meetings that would be covered or closed at the meeting. Summary at end of notes.

Southwark Council - Section 106 and Community Enhancement Fund updates 3

Southwark Council officer, JC, provided an update on the Section 106 schemes funded by the Tideway project and the Community Enhancement Fund. See slides 4-15 of the slide pack.

Section 106 projects

Scott Lidgett and Wickfield playground schemes have been consulted on and the designs agreed. The contract is out to be tendered, and Southwark Council hope to have appointed contractors shortly.

Community Enhancement Fund projects

JC fed back on the Community Enhancement Fund which was originally a £1million fund that can be applied to by residents and organisations for allocation to projects in the Chambers Wharf area. Most of the fund has now been allocated.

To date there have been 16 separate voting events. A total of 68 applications have been submitted by local residents and organisations. 58 applications have met the criteria and were approved by the panel with 10 being refused.

Projects recently approved by the panel include:

Transportation assistance for a local foodbank

JC updated to say that the Council is working with the resident to ensure the necessary food and hygiene certificate is in place and that the food is stored and located in a suitable location. It was noted that the foodbank is normally based by Fountain Green Square and by Southwark Station.

Question - A resident asked where the food was being sourced from.

Response - JC noted that it was from a range of suppliers and supermarkets.

Question - A resident asked if the sheds/storage that the Food Bank had recently put up near Fountain Green Square were paid for by the Community Enhancement Fund.

Response - JC noted they were not funded through this funding stream.

Schools Out @ Salmon

JC noted that the funding was for an Easter programme of events for young people at the Salmon Centre. It was noted that the Salmon Centre had previously applied for Summer and Winter programmes, so this was the third successful application to the Community Enhancement Fund. It was also noted that to attend the events the young people do need to be registered at the Centre.

Downside Youth Centre Zero to Hero

JC noted this is a recreational paddle sports and mentorship three-year programme with the aim of bringing recreational paddle sports to those who would not have the opportunity. JC noted that the centre is working with Team GB.

- Downside Youth Centre Girls Keep-Fit sessions

The funding was to support girls only sessions that have been requested by members to help stay fit and healthy.

- Geology display board and workshop

The application was for community workshops run by a freelance artist exploring layers of the local area through art and geology using earth samples collected from the shaft site at Chambers Wharf. A permanent display board would also be installed in the area. This board will however require planning permission to go ahead as the artist wants to locate the board within the new developer's area at Chambers Wharf.

Apply to the fund

Residents and organisations with community improvement ideas are encouraged to work together to make an application to the Community Enhancement Fund. Full details and the application form are available on Southwark Council's website at https://www.southwark.gov.uk/planning-environment-and-building-control/current-and-future-development/thames-tideway-tunnel-2.

The next deadline for submitting applications is the end February 2025. Of the original £1million, approximately £30,000 is remaining.

Question - A resident asked if the Food Bank could apply for any further funds. **Response** - JC noted that they could apply again.

Fountain Green Square

There was discussion by residents about a greening project that had not been completed at Fountain Green Square and that the flowerpots were left empty without being fully planted. JC noted that funding from the Community Enhancement Fund for greening and uplifting the square was awarded about a year ago with residents from the Square and an organisation called Wilder. During the installation of some of the planters, however, there was a resident protest, and the contractor decided to walk away from the project. A resident noted that the protest was small in number (two residents).

Question - Queries were raised with Southwark Council over what will happen with the planters and the approved funding if agreement cannot be made at Fountain Green Square.

Response - JC noted that the funding currently remains ringfenced for Fountain Green Square and this includes maintenance funding for a period of time. JC will continue to engage with residents regarding the project and will be coming to speak to residents from the Square about options for replacing the low fencing in the

coming months. It was noted that the current low fencing is in a bad condition and parts of it are rotten.

Question - A resident asked who was looking after the plants that had been planted. Another resident noted that he had been watering the plants when it had been very hot.

Action 1 - JC to speak to the Council's ground maintenance team to see what can be done regarding the plants that have been planted at Fountain Green Square.

A resident noted disappointment at the letter they had received from the Council about the scheme. JC noted that although that particular contractor wasn't going to continue with the project, JC would continue to try and get improvements agreed and implemented with the residents.

A resident asked Southwark Council plan to progress the Fountain Green Square project. JC said she would be talking to residents individually and she will take a consensus agreement to move forward.

PB noted that there may be further opportunities for enhancements / improvements once the new developer takes over the Chambers Wharf site and residents could engage with them.

A resident asked about the car barrier at the entrance to the Square. JC noted that that work has already been completed by Southwark's housing team.

4 Update on the wider project

EB provided an update on the wider Tideway project.

- The tunnel is now built and is 25km long, stretching from Acton to Abbey Mills near Stratford where it joins the existing Lee Tunnel to Beckton.
- Major construction work has been completed underground and we are now starting to connect the 20 combined sewer overflow sites into the super sewer. This means that we have started to clean up the River Thames.
- There will be more press announcements on our activation progress over the coming months.
- We hope to be fully operational in 2025.

Question - A resident asked if that meant Tideway were removing sewage from the Thames.

Response - EB noted that it means we are gradually stopping sewage going into the Thames as it will be diverted into our new tunnel. It was noted that Chambers Wharf doesn't have a combined sewer overflow point as it was the location that the tunnel boring machines were lowered / removed from the bottom of the shaft.

Question - A resident asked will you be able to swim in the river.

Response - EB stated that the strong currents make it unsafe to swim in in central London.

Question – A resident asked if the Tideway tunnel will have any impact on the usage of the Thames Barrier.

Action 2 – DD at Thames Water to take question away and follow up.

Post meeting note – Thames Water have provided an update to say that the answer to this question is no. The Thames Barrier is for tidal flooding risk in the capital, the Tideway tunnel does not have any effect on the tide and therefore would not have any effect on the usage of the Thames Barrier. Action closed.

Question - A resident asked if sewage reduction is being monitored and if the Environment Agency are involved.

Response - EB noted that monitoring is ongoing and that we work closely with the Environment Agency, Defra and Thames Water among others.

5 Updates from Chambers Wharf project team

JHS provided an update from the Chambers Wharf site team. See slides 18-29 in the slide pack.

The works completed since the last meeting include:

- Kiosk works electrical panel installation and shaft instrumentation has been installed. We need to finish the cladding next.
- Shaft and Air Treatment Unit the pavement backfill have been completed and the surface drainage work has started
- River wall capping beam the central section of the river wall parapet has been completed ahead of work to remove the cofferdam.
- Luna House jetty the cutting of the sheet piles has been completed, and we are currently cutting back the existing jetty

A resident wanted a copy of the aerial photographs that feature her property.

Action 3 - EB to email the relevant photographs to her. Action closed.

Question – An attendee asked whether the large white building had been removed? **Response** – The team confirmed that the acoustic enclosure had been removed from site.

Cofferdam Removal

JHS showed the area of the cofferdam that needs to be removed (slide 21). The cofferdam is the temporary area of land that was built out into the river. The team now need to return the site to its earlier alignment.

The team has completed installing two new sheet pile cross walls which will help to create a solid base for the excavators and other machinery to sit on while we remove the cofferdam.

The first area of the cofferdam to be excavated will be the 'hinterland'. This sits in the middle area of the temporary are, before moving onto the western and eastern sides. We will need to remove the temporary sheet piles that formed the area.

We plan to continue using barges throughout the cofferdam removal to remove fill material and piles.

Question - A resident asked where the cofferdam fill material is going.

Response – JB noted that the material is taken to Tilbury where it is cleaned and recycled for other construction projects.

Upcoming works include:

- Adding wooden fenders to the river wall
- Continuing to clad the river wall in new panels
- At Loftie Street we are also creating a new access gate for the Thames Water infrastructure.
- On the western side of the site, we have been working to connect the existing jetty infrastructure to our new river wall.

Question – A resident asked if there is a chance the completion date will be pushed back further.

Response – Yes there is a chance as this programme is dependent on the remaining works and engineering challenges. We are working to our current programme, and the aim is to finish in Summer 2025. This programme has been holding for the last two years.

A 3D image was shown depicting the river wall panels and ventilation columns. It was noted that the current ventilation columns are temporary.

Question – Why is there a gate going into Loftie Street? Is it permanent? **Response** – It is a temporary access gate that will separate Thames Water's infrastructure from the new developer's area.

Question – Will the Thames Path follow the river wall? Will it be open to the public? **Response** – Yes, the Thames Path following the alignment of the river wall that we are currently reinstating. It won't be opened up by Tideway but will open once the new development is finished. A resident noted that this section of river wall is new and has not previously existed.

Noise and air quality 6

LC ran through the latest noise monitoring results since the last meeting

- There have been four Section 61 noise exceedances in the last 6 months. Two of these were during sheet pile installation and two were during concrete breaking
- There have been four Air Quality Monitoring exceedances in the last 6 months (24h PM10)

Any exceedances shown by the monitors are investigated thoroughly after the team is alerted. Work was stopped and the team revaluated how they could carry out the activity. Vibration monitoring was also taking place.

The team are aware of the impact to residents, and we appreciate your patience with us. To try to minimise our impact the team also:

- Plans construction methodologies with noise impacts as a key consideration (Section 61 consent)
- Monitors noise across the site to identify exceptional noise sources
- Uses acoustic screening around static plant where possible
- Uses localised screening for loud activities (concrete breaking, floor sawing etc.) where possible
- Sources/develops low noise plant and equipment where possible
- Shuts down plant and equipment when it is not in use
- Fabricates construction elements offsite where possible
- Uses mains electricity to power equipment where practicable
- Uses alternative concrete cutting techniques to reduce noise when breaking concrete

A resident reported a beeping excavator that she has raised with the Helpdesk.

Action 4 – Team to investigate the beeping excavator and to report back.

Post meeting note - After investigation, the 50th excavator may have been the machine making the beeping noise. This was a very large excavator, and the noise is a safety feature so people in the area are aware of the reversing. The excavator was demobilised from site on the 8 November so beeping should have ceased. Action closed.

Trigger Action Plans 7

EB noted that at the start of the project, Tideway installed a series of noise mitigation measures at various properties in line with our Trigger Action Plan process.

As works at Chambers Wharf start to finish, the noise mitigation previously installed will be removed if this has been requested.

The noise mitigation measures installed were primarily:

- External balcony screens
- Internal secondary glazing
- Ventilation units

The team sent out letters in 2023 to confirm relevant recipient's preference on whether they wished to keep these permanently or have them removed. We now have established what needs to be removed and are preparing for arranging the removal works. If you have received noise mitigation measures and haven't been sent a letter, please let us know.

Next steps: If you told us that you want to retain noise mitigation measures permanently:

• We'll be posting close-out letters, which we'll ask you to sign and return. This will look to formalise your acceptance permanently.

If you told us that you wanted to have any noise mitigation measures removed:

• We'll contact you in the coming months to organise the removal of the relevant elements (and make good of any holes, damage etc.)

The freeholders of Axis Court and Luna House have stated we must remove the external balcony screens installed, regardless of leaseholder / resident preferences.

Question – Will residents get notice before balcony screens are removed? **Response** – Yes, we will be in contact ahead of the works.

8 Mitigation

Independent Compensation Panel (ICP)

EB reminded attendees that if a resident believes they will be affected by the upcoming activities or the cofferdam removal works, they can download the application form from the Tideway website: here

The ICP will continue to meet frequently until the end of cofferdam removal work and have arranged a fast-track process which priorities people who have already been approved by the panel and have a direct view of the site. Mitigation from the impacts of the cofferdam removal could include things such as:

- noise cancelling headphones
- temporary office accommodation, if you work from home
- periods of daily respite, to enable you to leave your property during noisier periods
- reimbursement for daytime activities undertaken during noisy periods
- short term or long-term rehousing, during cofferdam removal works

To be considered for additional mitigation you will need to make an application to the ICP and specify the mitigation you believe will be suitable for your personal circumstances.

9 Contacting Tideway

Residents can continue to contact us by emailing helpdesk@tideway.london or telephoning 08000 30 80 80.

It was noted that from December, during office hours the helpdesk will be staffed by internal staff rather than by an outsourced call centre.

Question - Does the Helpdesk have contact with this site?

Response – Yes, all emails and calls relating to Chambers Wharf are forwarded to MG and EB. During nighttime hours there is a mechanism for the Helpdesk to contact the manager on duty.

EB also noted that River Thames our magazine has been sent out over the summer to local residents. There is likely to be one more magazine coming your way.

EB also encouraged residents to check our social media channels and YouTube page for lots of sewer related content and videos.

10 Legacy and Community Investment

MG reminded residents of the different channels we use to communicate about the project – including the weekly emails which goes out to 300 email addresses.

MG updated on some of the volunteering, fundraising and positive impacts made by the team. Highlights include:

- River Times distributed to circa 16,000 households around the east sites
- CVB Person Protection Equipment (PPE) donation to Constructionarium in Norfolk
- Work experience: 14 students have been hosted this year by the east team.
 79 have been hosted over the years.
- London Design & Engineering University Technical College careers day & student mentoring has taken place
- A boat trip was taken with Harris Academy students to showcase sustainability job opportunities
- We visited Bounceback, a charity for employing ex-offenders visit at HMP Brixton
- Environmental charity Thames 21 has undertaken a wet wipe count supported by the team at Hammersmith
- We have supported the Wrayburn House community event promotion, and have helped with planter deliveries
- St Michael's School also visited the site for a talk on biodiversity

Highlights from the wider project include:

- Widespread media coverage when we put the final shaft lid on the super sewer and started testing the system
- British Construction Industry Awards: Tideway wins included environmental project of the year and project of the year and at the Better Society awards Tideway was awarded Highly Commended
- Tideway Sustainability Report has been published
- Tideway shortlisted for International Tunnelling Awards Major Project of the Year over \$500M
- Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, visited Victoria with Steve Reed, Secretary of State for the Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (DEFRA)

MG showed the latest aerials for the six sites across the eastern section (slide 40).

Two residents noted that they had attended the March for Clean Water protest and had been really inspired by the numbers of people who attended.

Question – What has happened to the Saxon fish trap

Response – It is still there and has been protected during construction.

Question – Why are the fenders wooden?

Response – They can be easily replaced if a boat contacts the structure and are widely used across the Thames.

Question – Is the Bermondsey Dolphin structure in the river, still there? **Response** – Yes, it is still there and will remain.

A resident noted that he had received what they described as a right of light letter from Thames Water / the new developer. It was confirmed that this is not a Tideway related matter and appeared to be a letter regarding the subsequent development. There was discussion regarding residents who had spoken to their legal representatives.

JC suggested residents could contact the Southwark Council planning department for further information.

DD at Thames Water suggested she make contact with the resident and see if there is any further information. Post meeting note - DD has contacted the resident directly.

11 Any other business

PB noted that there needs to be some thought from Tideway as to how to celebrate the end of the Tideway works at Chambers Wharf. EB noted that this will be looked at in due course.

Question – when will the site offices go?

Response – there is currently a planning application viewable on Southwark Council's planning portal to retain the offices for the next developer. There is no decision on this application currently.

Residents thanked Tideway for their explanation and time.

PB closed the meeting.
