Details of the award	<p>The claim is in respect of the footpath.</p> <p>The Panel has considered this request very carefully in respect of the difficulties the claimant is presently experiencing due to closure of the footpath which he normally would use to get to the shops, appointments etc. The Panel is fully aware of the claimant being registered as blind and the difficulties he has in walking anywhere safely. The ICP Chair made the Panel aware that, on a recent visit to the site, he observed one closure of the footpath adjacent to the site offices and two further restrictions of the footpath width associated with Tideway works. Further east of the Tideway site, there is also a closure of the footpath associated with the new development on the Hurlingham Retail Park site.</p> <p>The Panel has determined to award the claimant two respite days a week at the standard cost for both himself and a carer. The award will cease at the end of June 2025 when it is anticipated that the footpath will be fully open again in respect of Tideway's works.</p> <p>With respect to difficulties with submitting invoices, the Panel anticipates that any carer should be able to assist in this process; however, we also encourage Tideway to engage with</p>

Details of the award	<p>At ICP meeting # 273 held on the 14th of January 2025, the following was awarded to all fast-track claimants:</p> <p><i>The Panel has taken into account the nature of the ongoing construction programme and has determined to extend all existing fast-track awards until the end of July 2025 or when significant noise from the cofferdam works has ceased whichever is the sooner.</i></p> <p>The claimant was informed of this award but was then seeking additional respite</p> <p>The outcome of that meeting was as follows:</p> <p><i>The Panel has considered this claim very carefully particularly with respect to previous awards which have been made to the claimant and the location of the property. The Panel has considered the request for additional respite; however, has determined that the existing award is appropriate to the circumstances and therefore no additional award is made.</i></p> <p>The claimant is now appealing that decision directly to the ICP which is primarily that overnight stays were not awarded.</p> <p>The Panel is fully aware of the claimant's circumstances and had taken this into account in determining the previous award. The Panel notes the claimant's points with respect to the implementation of ICP decisions; however, the claimant should be aware that the Guidelines are not a list of mitigation which the claimant can choose from, rather how the decisions of the Panel will be implemented by Tideway.</p> <p>The Panel is fully aware of the on-going construction works and how they will be implemented by the contractors, having attended the</p>

	<p>recent Community Liaison Working Group meeting on the 12th of February 2025.</p> <p>The Panel has determined that the previous award (Meeting # 274, dated 28th January 2025) was appropriate to the circumstances that the Panel considered at that time. However, the Panel has considered the request for occasional overnight respite and has determined that the existing respite award may be accumulated to pay for occasional overnight stays away from the site. As the principal reason for the award of respite is to get away from the site when noisy works are occurring, the Panel would anticipate that the claimant would also continue to utilise the award for daily respite from time to time.
